Special Session Wednesday, March 10, 2021 at 8:30 a.m.**

MINUTES

The Board met in special session on Wednesday, March 10, 2021, at 8:30 a.m. in the Grand Courtroom and via online ZOOM with three members present. Roll Call: Present: David E Thompson, Chair; Bill Patten, Vice Chairman; Steve Salasek, Member. The assembled recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval or Amendment of Agenda. Motion by Salasek, second by Patten, to approve the agenda as printed. Roll call vote carried 3-0.


Sheriff Resignation. Motion by Patten, second by Salasek, to accept the resignation of Sheriff Hoffman, effective 5:00 PM, March 8, 2021. The Supervisors thanked Sheriff Hoffman for his years of service to the community and congratulated him on his new role as Chief Deputy in Polk County. Roll call vote carried 3-0.

Procedure to fill Vacancy of Sheriff. Plan for replacement, pending Board accepting resignation of Sheriff Hoffman. County Auditor/Recorder Benson reviewed the Iowa State Code requirements for filling a vacancy and explained if the Supervisors decide to appoint, the appointment must be within 40 days of the vacancy. The appointed individual will be on the ballot candidate in November 2022, to fill the unexpired two years of the original four year term. The public may call for a special election within 14 days of notice of appointment or within 15 days of the appointment, upon petition of 1828 eligible electors. The political party must also have a convention. After brief discussion, the Supervisors determined they want to move forward and fill the position by appointment, requiring applicants to submit a cover letter, resume and application. Appointed individuals must be a Peace Officer and have lived in Marshall County for six months. Benson recommended the job posting be posted for at least 10 days, with the Board conducting interviews as soon as practicable. The Board asked the Auditor/Recorder to prepare a press release announcing the position opening. The Board also asked Chief Deputy Joel Phillips to assume the responsibilities of Sheriff during the transition.

Adjournment. The next regular session is March 16, 2021, at 9:05 a.m. All business to be acted upon at that session should be submitted to the County Auditor and Recorder's Office or the Board of Supervisors' Office by **Wednesday, March 10, 2021, at 12:00 p.m.** There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting is adjourned at 8:41 a.m.
