

Marshall County Conservation Board
Regular Meeting August 9, 2021
GrimesFarm and Conservation Center.....5:00 p.m.

President, Tom Deimerly called the regular meeting of the Marshall County Conservation to order on Monday, August 9 at the GrimesFarm and Conservation Center at 5:00 p.m.

Board members present were Steve Armstrong, Pam Paone, Tom Mack, Tom Deimerly, and Rich Naughton. Staff present was Emily Herring, Jeremiah Manken, and Tami Krough. Public present were Julie Pickard, Sue Blaisdell, and County Attorney, Jordan Gaffney.

No changes were made to the agenda.

No public comments were made.

There was no corrections to the minutes of July 12, they were declared approved as presented.

On a motion by Paone, seconded by Mack, the Board approved the list of claims as presented with addendums. Voting in favor: Armstrong, Paone, Naughton, Deimerly, and Mack. Motion carried.

Julie Pickard presented information to the board about Iowa code 327G.81 and chapter 359A regarding fences, Pickard also provided information about easements.

The board discussed allowing archery deer hunting only in MCCB wildlife refuge areas (Timmons South, Grimes Farm north of Linn Creek, Coppock Park, Grammer Grove. Mack moved to approve archery deer hunting only in the wildlife refuge areas. Paone seconded the motion. Voting in favor: Mack, Armstrong, Deimerly, Naughton, and Paone. Motion carried. Mack moved to "Pursuant to Iowa Code Chapter 350.5, I move all hunting requires non-toxic shot only in all MCCB owned and managed areas., excluding slugs, single projectiles, and turkey to go into effect January 11, 2022." Paone seconded. . Voting in favor: Mack, Armstrong, Deimerly, Naughton, and Paone. Motion carried.


Paone moved to approve the grinding of 200 stump at four park locations from damages incurred by the derecho by Matt Husak using insurance money. Armstrong seconded. . Voting in favor: Mack, Armstrong, Deimerly, Naughton, and Paone. Motion carried.

Paone moved to approve concrete work on the Highway 330 bike trail by Aaron's Handyman Service for \$3,800. Mack seconded. . Voting in favor: Mack, Armstrong, Deimerly, Naughton, and Paone. Motion carried.

The board discussed the Iowa Department of Natural Resources for trees for derecho ravaged counties. Trees would need to be planted in the Fall and the grant is \$5,000 with a 1:1 match. Naughton moved to approve the submittal of the application to Derecho Community Forestry Grant Program for \$5,000 to be matched up to \$5,000. Mack seconded. . Voting in favor: Mack, Armstrong, Deimerly, Naughton, and Paone. Motion carried.

Naughton moved to adjourn at 5:37 p.m. Mack seconded. . Voting in favor: Mack, Armstrong, Deimerly, Naughton, and Paone. Motion carried.
