**MINUTES**

The Marshall County Board of Supervisors met in regular session according to the posted notices in the Courthouse, First Floor Meeting Room 1 East Main Street, Marshalltown, Iowa, and online via ZOOM. Chair Heil called the meeting to order on August 16<sup>th</sup>, 2023, at 9:00 a.m. Present: Chair Jarret Heil, Vice Chair Steve Salasek, Member Carol Hibbs, fully participating via Zoom. Salasek moved to approve the agenda second by Hibbs. Motion carried 3-0.

Salasek moved to adopt the **Consent Agenda**, second by Hibbs. Motion carried 3-0. Items:

1. Approve Regular Session Minutes, August 2nd, 2023.
2. Approve claims as audited and authorize the County Auditor and Recorder to issue payment of the same. The listing of claims paid at this meeting and all claims paid in the current month will be published as part of the first meeting of the following month.

**Project Bid Award-Marshall County Siren Project**

Motion by Hibbs second by Salasek to award the bid for the Marshall County siren project to Federal Signal, located in University Park, IL, in the amount of \$312,051.88. Motion carried 3-0.

**28E Agreement for Zoning Director, Sanitarian and Weed Commissioner**

Motion by Salasek second by Hibbs to approve the 28E agreement for Marshall and Tama County, Iowa, sharing of the Zoning Director, Sanitarian (Marshall County Only) and Weed Commissioner operations and costs. The perpetual agreement states Marshall County is the employer with Tama County paying quarterly. Motion carried 3-0.

**Public Forum** Mark Wyant, 2601 Ridge Road, Marshalltown, presented concerns regarding road repairs on 260<sup>th</sup> street to Ridge Road. Wyant states that the East side of the road has a drainage tile that needs to be replaced. Ruts are getting too deep, and the neighboring residents would like to see repairs done to make roads more passable and safer. Harlan Helgren, 2671 260<sup>th</sup> Street, presented his concerns regarding the safety of the road on 260<sup>th</sup> street. He stated that the road is unsafe due to poor grading, ruts in the road, a ravine that has developed and limited access to his mailbox. He would like to see signs placed or guardrails for the safety of those driving this road. Paul Geilenfeldt Marshall County Engineer spoke in response the road conditions on 260<sup>th</sup> street. Geilenfeldt stated that there is indeed a drainage problem here that needs an additional right away. There is also a need for ditches. Paving the road would take a large voluntary assessment. A guardrail is not possible due to lack of ground in this area. The county is aware of the condition of the road. George Haywood, Marshalltown, stated that he would like his jury trial moved out of Marshall County to get a fair trial. Haywood was advised that the Court needs to be notified of this request. Nan Benson Marshall County Auditor and Recorder provided information on a Special Election September 12, 2023, for Marshalltown

patrons. The MACC is not available for 3<sup>rd</sup> Ward voters on that date, so they will be voting at Redeemer Church.
