

Marshall County Board of Supervisors

MINUTES

The Marshall County Board of Supervisors met in regular session according to the posted notices in the Courthouse, First Floor Meeting Room 1 East Main Street, Marshalltown, Iowa, and online via ZOOM. Chair Heil called the meeting to order on November 6, 2024, at 9:00 a.m. Present: Chair Jarret Heil, Vice Chair Steve Salasek, Member Carol Hibbs. Salasek moved to approve the agenda second by Hibbs. Motion carried 3-0.

Hibbs moved to approve the Consent Agenda, second by Salasek. Motion carried 3-0. Items:

1. Approve claims as audited and authorize the County Auditor and Recorder to issue payment of the same. The listing of claims paid at this meeting and all claims paid in the current month will be published as part of the first meeting of the following month.

End of Consent Agenda.

Program Update: David Hicks, YSS of Marshall County Quarterly Report.

David Hicks with YSS of Marshall County presented the quarterly report which included a breakdown of how funding was used. Between Marshalltown Community Schools, West Marshall, and East Marshall they are utilizing family therapy services for kids and families in need which keeps kids from being pulled out of school during the day and gives YSS the opportunity to see the kids in a family setting. Hicks stated that the close relationships between YSS and local law enforcement agencies has been very beneficial to getting people the help they need as well.

2024 County Weed Commissioner Certification Form and Weed Commissioner Report.

Motion by Hibbs, second by Salasek to file the 2024 County Weed Commissioner Certification Form and Weed Commissioner Report and authorize the Chair to sign. Marshall County Planning and Zoning Director and Weed Commissioner Tyler Kelley provided clarification on these reports that are due annually by all Iowa counties. Kelley stated that he is wanting to schedule some Lunch and Learn programs in order to help people identify noxious weeds correctly. Motion carried 3-0.

Discussion and Possible Action: Marshall County Conservation Exemption to Personnel Policy Section 4.3 Regarding Compensatory Time.

Motion by Salasek, second by Hibbs to approve an exemption to personnel policy section 4.3 for Marshall County Conservation regarding compensatory time. Emily Herring, Marshall County Conservation Director, and Jeannie Ferneau, Marshall County Accounting/HR, provided clarification on this item. This exemption would make it so Conservation employees are able to accrue 80 hours of compensatory time, however only 40 hours of that will be able to be carried past February 1st of each year. Motion carried 3-0.

Approve purchase of a Kubota BR560 Concrete Breaker from Central Iowa Farm Store of Marshalltown for \$15,500.

Motion by Hibbs, second by Salasek to approve the purchase of a Kubota BR560 Concrete Breaker from Central Iowa Farm Store of Marshalltown for \$15,500. Paul Geilenfeldt, Marshall County Engineer, provided clarification on this item. This is for the replacement of an existing

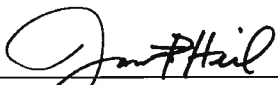
unit that is 12 years old and is used as an attachment to break up concrete culverts. Motion carried 3-0.

Public Forum. Mark Wyant spoke about a grading issue on Ridge Rd. Paul Geilenfeldt stated that the timing and weather conditions have an impact on the way the grading is able to be done. Marshall County Auditor/Recorder Nan Benson gave many thanks to poll workers for their hard work and dedication on Election Day which went smoothly. Heil mentioned that the County LOSST item on the General Election ballot did not pass. He stated he will be working with Ahlers & Cooney to get the item re-worded and possibly have it on the ballot in March of 2025.

Closed Session Per Iowa Code 21.5(1)(g) Law Enforcement Matters and Investigation.

Motion by Hibbs, second by Salasek to enter into closed session at 9:42 a.m. pursuant to Section 21.5, subsection 1, paragraph g of the Code of Iowa, to discuss specific law enforcement matters, such as current or proposed investigations or inspections or auditing techniques or schedules which would enable law violators to avoid detection. Motion carried 3-0. Motion by Salasek, second by Hibbs to end closed session at 9:53 a.m. and return to open session. Motion carried 3-0. Motion by Hibbs, second by Salasek to proceed as discussed in closed session. Motion carried 3-0.

Adjournment. The next regular session is Wednesday, November 20, 2024 at 9:00 a.m., at the Courthouse, 1st floor meeting room, 1 E Main Street. All business to be acted upon at that session should be submitted to the County Auditor and Recorder's Office or the Board of Supervisors' Office by Wednesday, November 13, 2024 at 12:00 p.m. There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting is adjourned at 9:54 a.m.
